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Tony Culyer is Ontario Research Professor of Health Policy & System Design in the faculty of Medicine at the University of Toronto (Canada) and a professor of economics at the University of York (England). He is a founding father of health economics. He was founding co-editor of the *Journal of Health Economics* and the founding Organiser of the (UK) Health Economists' Study Group, the first of its kind anywhere. He was, from its creation in 1999 until 2003, Vice Chair of the National Institute for Health and Care Excellence (NICE) and is chair of NICE International's Advisory Committee.

Dr. Culyer has published around 300 articles in various books and scholarly journals and he has written or edited 33 books. He is a founding Fellow of the Academy of Medical Sciences. His honours include Commander of the British Empire, Hon DEcon (Stockholm School of Economics) and Honorary Fellow of the Royal College of Physicians of London.

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
